TAX INFORMATION

Tax Bills should be mailed out in June or early July. If you have a mailing address change, please be sure to contact our office.

Ensuring that your mailing address is up to date with the municipal office, it is important if you have recently purchased your property or have moved.

If you have recently purchased your property, please check with the office that a tax bill is being mailed to you, as it may have been mailed to the previous owners.

If your tax bill indicates that you have arrears, please contact the office prior to making payment to ensure that you are paying the correct amount.

Arrears accumulate interest at a rate of 1.25% per month, and the amount showing on the tax bill includes interest up to May 31st, 2023

Receipts for payment will be mailed back to you.

Please note that 2023 property taxes are due and payable by Tuesday, October 31st at 4:00 PM

Taxes Added/Cancelled – The 1st batch of taxes added or cancelled bills will be going out shortly and will be due by October 31st, the same as regular taxes. These bills are a result of changes to your property ie: subdivision, adding a building or demolishing a building.

Burn Ban Lifted - Burn Permits Required

The Burn Ban has been lifted; however, you are required to obtain a burn permit if you wish to burn on your property (excluding recreational fires i.e.: wiener roast) Please do not burn house hold garbage or recycling, this can be brought to the landfill. Thanks for thinking about our environment!

SW 1/4 21-3-8E in the RM of Stuartburn (the "Proposed Subdivision"), pursuant to Section 129(1)(a) of The Planning Act

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that, under the provisions of The Planning Act, S.M. 2005, c.30 and The Municipal Board Act, R.S.M. 1987, c. M240, the Board will hold a public hearing to hear the Appeal regarding the Proposed Subdivision.

The public hearing will take place on Thursday, July 13 and Friday July 14, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. at the Friendship Centre, 226 Home Street, Vita, Manitoba.

Any person may make a representation on the matter to be considered at the hearing. A person who wishes to make a written and/or oral presentation to the Board must register by filing a completed Public Presenter Form with the Board at least ten (10) working days prior to the hearing.

The Board requires that a person who intends on filing a written submission must file four (4) copies of that material with the Board, one (1) copy with the Municipality and (1) copy with the Approving Authority at least ten (10) working days prior to the hearing.

Results: Introducing the Shared Legacy Partnership

After three years of consultation and planning, we are thrilled to officially announce the Shared Legacy Partnership. Our goal is to help advance understanding of the wonder of Manitoba's Tall Grass Prairie Natural Area, its relationship with agriculture, and the natural heritage that benefits all residents.

This is a cooperative working group led by the Rural Municipality of Stuartburn and The Nature Conservancy of Canada (NCC) along with partners Sunrise Corner Economic Development and Province of Manitoba. We have three key areas of focus:

- Nature: creating and delivering a strategy for sharing our unique nature in the RM of Stuartburn with future generations.
- Culture: engaging with local producers, landowners,
 Stuartburn residents, and Indigenous communities to guide our direction.
- Economy: pursuing "win-win" solutions that work for the ecosystem, landowners, residents, our economy, and communities.

A hidden gem centered right here in Sunrise Corner, the Tall Grass Prairie Natural Area covers 445,628 hectares and supports one of the largest and last remaining tall-grass prairie landscapes in North America. It forms the northern end of an international conservation corridor comprised of protected and managed prairies, wetlands, forests and streams within a working landscape that includes conservation, agriculture and eco-tourism. The tall-grass prairie is home to 28 listed Canadian species at risk (SAR), such as the monarch butterfly, the globally rare Poweshiek skipperling butterfly, and the Western prairie fringed orchid. Many of these species depend on the tall-grass prairie for their very survival.

Shared Legacy Partnership invites you to learn more about the tall-grass prairie and the species at risk that call it home. We will be participating in Vita Canada Day festivities on July 1st, with a float in the parade and a booth at the vendor market to answer questions. We will also be offering two guided tours at NCC's Agassiz Trail west of Vita to view the spectacular western prairie fringed orchid that will be in full bloom at that time; it's the only place you can see these unique perennials in Canada. SPECIES AT RISK

Information Available for the Stewardship Credit Pilot Program

Hello, RM of Stuartburn! By now, you have hopefully heard of the Stewardship Credit Pilot Program (SCPP), but you may still have some questions about how the program is run. If you would like any more information or are just curious, please drop by the Shared Legacy booth during the Vita Canada Day celebrations on July 1st.

Over the last two years, the SCPP has brought together community residents, the RM of Stuartburn and the Nature Conservancy of Canada (NCC) to conserve and maintain the remaining tall-grass prairie for future generations to enjoy. We are excited to announce that the program has been extended for another three years and we are looking for more participants to join the program!

As part of SCPP, participants receive annual payments based on the quality and quantity of their prairie. Participants are encouraged to use their expertise and experience, supported by the RM of Stuartburn and NCC, if requested, to implement management that works best for both their own goals, and the habitats and species on their property. Examples of management can include grazing, invasive species, and woody encroachment control, and more. Eligible management activities may also be supported by the cost-shared component of the program. If you think you have native prairie and reside within the program boundary (RM of Stuartburn and surrounding area), we would love to hear from you!
